It has been an exciting and fruitful year for St Peter's Hall. One of our key initiatives has been raising awareness of our mission by engaging directly with parishes across the Diocese through our "SPH Hits the Road" Roadshow 2025.

The roadshow visits have been a blessing, allowing us to share our vision, strengthen relationships, and invite greater participation in the work of equipping the Church.

Another significant milestone this year is the full launch of the Diocesan Certificate of Biblical Studies (DCBS) on our website. With the entire programme now accessible through our online learning management system, members of the Diocese can study each module at their own pace!

This initiative reflects our commitment to making Christian education and training widely available, equipping believers to grow in biblical understanding and practical ministry.

Archbishop Titus Chung, in outlining the mandate he has given to St Peter's Hall, raised this pressing question:

"Given the volatile state of the world and its subtle influences upon church members, how can the Church remain true to her calling and faithfully fulfil her duty as custodian of the faith?"

He emphasised that theological training and various forms of education are vital in addressing this challenge. He was convinced the Diocese needed a dedicated vehicle to provide sustained, clear, and intentional training and equipping.

"I decided that St Peter's Hall, already having 65 years of track record in training, could be restructured and given a new mandate to be that vehicle, and become the Training Arm of the entire Diocese."

We are grateful to play a part in this vision and look forward with excitement to what God will continue to do through the ministry of St Peter's Hall.

SPH ROADSHOW 2025









Over the past few months, the SPH team has been actively visiting parishes and congregations across the Diocese to share about the launch of our new website and the exciting opportunities now available through our Learning Management System (LMS). This platform hosts a growing library of training videos designed to equip and empower lay members for ministry, all accessible anytime and anywhere.



Since April 2025, we have had the privilege of visiting 10 parishes and over 20 congregations. At each stop, we introduced members to the our website, guiding them step-by-step as they signed up for their own accounts.



To help them begin their learning journey right away, each member who registered was also given free digital tokens that can be used to unlock training modules on the platform.



The SPH Roadshow has been a wonderful opportunity not only to demonstrate the practical use of the system, but also to connect personally with members of our wider Anglican family. We have enjoyed many meaningful conversations during these sessions and witnessed the enthusiasm of those eager to grow in their understanding of Scripture and ministry.



The response from lay members has been overwhelmingly encouraging. Many have expressed appreciation for the resources now made available to them and affirmed the importance of making training more accessible to the wider church community. Such encouragement spurs us on in our mission to serve the Diocese by continuing to develop more content and training opportunities that will bless and strengthen our congregations.

We look forward to visiting even more parishes in the months ahead and walking alongside you as, together, we build up the body of Christ through learning, equipping, and serving.

INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTIAN CARE AND COUNSELLING (ICCC) ASIA 2025





The Introduction to Christian Care and Counselling (ICCC) Asia 2025 was a 5-day stay-in course held between 30 June - 4 July 2025, bringing together 27 participants from across the Anglican Diocese. Representing both chaplaincy settings and parish ministries, they engaged in a foundational course that explored biblical perspectives and practical approaches to Christian care and counselling.

In a world where many face stress, brokenness, and pain, the Church is called to be a source of Christ's healing and hope. ICCC Asia 2025 equipped participants with biblically grounded insights, practical counselling skills, and Christcentred methods to serve the needs of individuals, families, and communities.

Beyond training, the course fostered fellowship among ministry workers from diverse contexts, strengthening their shared commitment to extend Christ's care and compassion in every area of their ministry.


















DIOCESE CERTIFICATE OF BIBLICAL STUDIES (DCBS)

The 18 modules cover all 66 books of the Bible, helping participants gain deeper understanding and practical application. Each module (8-12 lessons) awards a Certificate of Completion.

Modules can be taken in any order, though firsttime participants are encouraged to begin with free Modules 1A and 1B (OT and NT overviews).
